

QUALIFYING STANDARDS

PACE:

2:02 (AGED)

2:03 3YOs

2:05 2YOs

TROT:

2:04 (AGED)

2:05 3YOs

2:07 2YOs

- 1 second from a 5/8ths track
- 2 seconds from a track larger than 5/8ths

All time allowances specified in a charted line from any track will be honored.

As of Friday, June 2014, aged horses will be given 3 chances to make qualifying time. If standards are not met, a clean line from another track must be attained before permission will be granted to return to Batavia Downs.

GENERAL RULES

- Alternate events will only be considered if said event did not fill 8 eligible standards at time of entry. Horses entered in the Winners-Over or Open Handicap can be moved within those classes at the discretion of the Racing Secretary.
- Claiming Authorizations need to be on file in the Race Office for ALL horses entered in the claiming events.
- Any Horse claimed at Batavia must race at BATAVIA for 90 days from the claiming date.
- No paper entries will be accepted. Only phone and electronic entries will be accepted from trainers stabled on the grounds.
- Any horse already entered will not be allowed to re-enter until they have raced. Therefore, there will be no in-to-go entries. This is in the best interest of the equine athlete and BATAVIA DOWNS.
- Horses stabled at Batavia Downs ARE NOT allowed to leave to race at another facility. If a horse leaves Batavia Downs to race at another facility the horse will NOT be allowed back and the Trainer is subject to the loss of a stall from their allocation.
- Any horse that fails the S.C.R. Blood Gas Testing (TCOS) guidelines established and performed by S.C.R. will be scratched as will any horse that is determined to be in violation of the NYSGC Rule #4120.
- To avoid being scratched and/or fined, the trainer of record should be in the paddock unless said trainer designates another trainer and both trainers have the proper insurance certificate on file with the Commission. For any questions regarding this policy, please call the Judges at 585-343-3750 ext. 6364 or the NYSGC. Unless you have an approved worker's compensation policy filed, you must paddock the horse yourself.
